Collins Street Specialist Centre — dental specialists near Melbourne CBD

Getting to a dental specialist in central Melbourne shouldn't be complicated. Collins Street Specialist Centre (CSSC) brings every dental specialty together at one address in the heart of the CBD. Orthodontics, endodontics, periodontics, prosthodontics, oral surgery, paediatric dentistry — all of it is available at 220 Collins Street.

Our location: the Manchester Unity Building

CSSC is located inside the Manchester Unity Building at 220 Collins Street, on the corner of Collins and Swanston Streets.

A Melbourne landmark

The Manchester Unity Building is a heritage-listed art deco building completed in 1932. At 12 storeys with its distinctive tower, it's one of the finest examples of art deco architecture in Australia. The marble foyer — brass detailing, terrazzo floors, intricate ceiling work — gives patients a genuine encounter with Melbourne's architectural history before they've even reached the practice.

CSSC occupies multiple levels within the building, with modern dental technology fitted throughout while the architectural character of the building has been left intact.

Getting to CSSC

Being in the CBD makes Collins Street Specialist Centre one of the most accessible specialist dental practices in Melbourne — which matters when patients are managing long treatment schedules or travelling from further away.

By train

CSSC sits between Melbourne's two main train stations:

- **Flinders Street Station** — serves all metropolitan train lines. CSSC is about a 5-minute walk north along Swanston Street from the Flinders Street entrance. - **Melbourne Central Station** — serves the City Loop lines. CSSC is about a 5-minute walk south along Swanston Street. Use the La Trobe Street or Swanston Street exits.

Both stations connect to the full Melbourne metropolitan rail network, so CSSC is reachable from virtually anywhere in the city and surrounding suburbs.

By tram

Collins Street is one of Melbourne's main tram corridors:

- **Routes 11, 12, 48 and 109** run along Collins Street, stopping directly outside or within a block of the Manchester Unity Building. - **Swanston Street trams** (routes 1, 3, 5, 6, 16, 64, 67, 72) stop at the Collins Street intersection, right next to the centre. - **Free Tram Zone** — CSSC falls within Melbourne's Free Tram Zone, so tram travel to and from the centre is free from anywhere within the CBD and surrounding inner-city area, including Docklands and parts of Spring Street.

By bus

Several bus routes service the CBD, with stops along Swanston Street, Collins Street and Elizabeth Street — all within easy walking distance of CSSC.

By car

Public transport is usually the most practical option, but driving to the CBD is straightforward enough:

- **Wilson Parking — Manchester Unity** — parking is available inside the Manchester Unity Building, with access from Swanston Street. This is the most convenient option for patients arriving by car. - **QV Melbourne Car Park** — on Lonsdale Street, about a 5-minute walk from CSSC. - **Chinatown Car Park** — on Little Bourke Street, another nearby option. - **Other CBD car parks** — there are multiple commercial car parks within a short walk of the centre.

Metered street parking is available on surrounding streets, though spots during business hours can be hard to find.

By bicycle

Melbourne's cycling network connects directly to the CBD. Bike parking and bike-share stations are available close to the Manchester Unity Building.

All dental specialties in one centre

CSSC's multi-disciplinary model means patients and referring practitioners can access every dental specialty without navigating separate practices across Melbourne. Having all disciplines under one roof makes coordinated treatment planning considerably more practical.

Orthodontics

Our orthodontists assess and correct tooth alignment and bite issues using the full range of current orthodontic techniques:

- Traditional metal and ceramic braces - Clear aligner therapy (including Invisalign) - Lingual (behind-the-teeth) braces - Early intervention orthodontics for children - Surgical orthodontics, carried out with our oral surgeons, for complex jaw discrepancies

Endodontics

Our endodontists focus on saving the natural tooth through root canal treatment and related procedures:

- Primary root canal treatments - Retreatment of previously failed root canals - Endodontic microsurgery (apicoectomy) - Internal bleaching of discoloured root canal-treated teeth - Management of dental trauma - Cracked tooth assessment and treatment

Periodontics

Our periodontists manage the health of the structures supporting the teeth and provide specialist implant care:

- Non-surgical and surgical management of periodontal disease - Gum grafting for recession correction
- Crown lengthening - Dental implant placement - Bone grafting and guided bone regeneration - Sinus lift procedures - Treatment of peri-implantitis

Prosthodontics

Our prosthodontists restore and replace teeth with attention to both function and appearance:

- Porcelain crowns and bridges - Porcelain veneers - Implant-supported restorations (single crowns, bridges and full-arch prosthetics) - Dentures, both conventional and implant-retained - Full mouth rehabilitation - Complex cosmetic treatment planning - Digital smile design

Oral and maxillofacial surgery

Our oral surgeons handle a wide range of surgical procedures, from routine extractions to complex reconstructive cases:

- Wisdom tooth removal - Dental implant placement, including complex and staged cases - Bone grafting and sinus augmentation - Jaw surgery (orthognathic surgery) - Biopsy and management of oral pathology - Cyst and tumour removal - Facial trauma management - TMJ surgery - IV sedation for patients with dental anxiety

Paediatric dentistry

Our paediatric dentists provide child-centred care across all stages of dental development:

- First dental visits and preventive care - Treatment of childhood dental conditions - Management of dental anxiety in children - Dental trauma management - Fissure sealants and fluoride treatments - Treatment under sedation or general anaesthesia where clinically indicated

General and cosmetic dentistry

Our general dentists provide comprehensive everyday dental care:

- Check-ups and professional cleans - Fillings and restorations - Teeth whitening, both in-chair and take-home - Composite bonding - Emergency dental care - Preventive care and oral health education

Walk-in and emergency availability

Dental emergencies don't keep business hours. CSSC operates primarily by appointment, but we make every effort to see urgent cases as quickly as possible:

- ****Severe toothache**** — can often be assessed and treated the same day - ****Dental trauma**** — knocked-out, fractured or displaced teeth need prompt attention. Call us immediately and we'll arrange an emergency appointment - ****Post-surgical concerns**** — patients recovering from procedures at CSSC should contact us directly for clinical advice and follow-up care - ****Swelling and infection**** — facial swelling, dental abscesses and signs of spreading infection are treated as a clinical priority

For dental emergencies during practice hours, call us directly. We'll do everything we can to see you the same day.

Why a CBD location matters

Being central isn't just convenient — for many patients, it's the difference between completing a course of specialist treatment and letting it drag on or lapse entirely.

Lunch-break appointments

For people working in the CBD, a suburban dental appointment usually means taking a significant chunk out of the workday. At CSSC, consultations, check-ups and shorter procedures can often fit

within a standard lunch break, with patients back at their desk the same afternoon.

Before and after work

Appointment times accommodate CBD professionals who prefer early morning or end-of-day slots. Arrive by train or tram, attend the appointment, get on with the day.

Specialist access without suburban travel

Dental specialists are often based in suburban practices, which can mean real travel time and parking headaches. CSSC puts every specialty in the CBD, reachable by public transport from across Melbourne's rail and tram network.

Multi-appointment convenience

Complex treatment frequently involves coordinated appointments across multiple specialties over months. When all the treating specialists are at the same address, scheduling and attending those appointments is far more manageable.

Nearby amenities

The Collins and Swanston Street precinct has cafés, restaurants, pharmacies and retail immediately nearby, for patients who want to take care of other errands before or after their appointment.

Areas we serve

Patients come to Collins Street Specialist Centre from across Melbourne and regional Victoria. Our central location works particularly well for people in the following areas.

Melbourne CBD

Residents and workers throughout the central business district — Spring Street to Spencer Street, Flinders Street to La Trobe Street — are within easy walking distance.

Southbank and South Melbourne

Just across the Yarra, Southbank and South Melbourne residents can reach CSSC within minutes via the pedestrian bridges, tram or a short drive.

Docklands

Docklands residents and workers can take a free tram along Collins Street directly to the centre — about 10 minutes.

Carlton and Parkville

The university and hospital precinct to the north is well-connected by Swanston Street trams. Carlton residents can typically reach CSSC in under 10 minutes.

East Melbourne and Jolimont

A short tram along Collins Street or a walk through the Treasury and Fitzroy Gardens connects East Melbourne to CSSC.

Richmond and Cremorne

Train to Flinders Street or Melbourne Central, or tram, with the journey typically 10–15 minutes.

Fitzroy, Collingwood and Abbotsford

Trams along Swanston Street and buses along Victoria Parade make CSSC accessible within 15–20 minutes from the inner north-east.

South Yarra, Prahran and Toorak

Train to Flinders Street takes 5–10 minutes on the Sandringham or Frankston line. Tram via St Kilda Road and Swanston Street is another option.

North Melbourne and West Melbourne

A short tram ride, or a comfortable walk, from these inner suburbs.

Broader Melbourne

With Flinders Street and Melbourne Central both nearby, patients from anywhere on Melbourne's suburban rail network can reach CSSC within 30–60 minutes. Many patients from the eastern, south-eastern, northern and western suburbs specifically choose CSSC because specialist dental appointments can be worked into their regular commute.

Regional Victoria

V/Line regional train services terminate at Southern Cross Station, which is a short tram ride or about a 15-minute walk from CSSC. We regularly see patients from Geelong, Ballarat, Bendigo and other regional centres who need specialist dental care that isn't available locally.

Our commitment to Melbourne

Collins Street Specialist Centre has been providing specialist dental care from the Manchester Unity Building for many years. Staying at this address is a deliberate choice — specialist dental care should be accessible and genuinely convenient for the patients who need it.

We invest in advanced clinical technology, work with practitioners of demonstrated specialist expertise, and maintain rigorous standards of care. All treating specialists hold current registration with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA). Patients can verify any clinician's specialist registration through the [AHPRA public register](<https://www.ahpra.gov.au/Registration/Registers-of-Practitioners.aspx>), which confirms that a practitioner holds the appropriate specialist title and qualifications.

All of this, from the heart of Melbourne, at one of the city's most recognisable and accessible addresses.

Information for referring practitioners

Collins Street Specialist Centre welcomes referrals from general dental practitioners and other health professionals across Melbourne and regional Victoria. Our multi-disciplinary model supports collaborative treatment planning, and we keep referring practitioners informed throughout the treatment process.

Where cases require input across multiple specialties — combined periodontic and prosthodontic treatment, or orthodontic and surgical planning, for example — our co-located team is well-placed to coordinate that care without patients needing to attend separate practices.

Referral letters can be directed to the relevant specialist at our Collins Street address. We aim to keep referring practitioners updated on assessment findings and treatment progress in a timely manner.
