How general and specialist care work together

Some clinical situations, though, call for a different level of expertise:

- Root canal treatment in teeth with complex or calcified anatomy, or where previous endodontic treatment has failed
- Periodontal disease that hasn't responded adequately to standard non-surgical management
- Children presenting with severe dental anxiety, acute dental trauma, or developmental dental conditions
- Full mouth rehabilitation requiring coordinated input across multiple dental specialties

These are the situations where an AHPRA-registered specialist — someone who has completed three to five additional years of full-time, university-based postgraduate training in their discipline — tends to get better results. The CSSC model

Collins Street Specialist Centre brings together AHPRA-registered specialists across all six recognised dental specialties: oral and maxillofacial surgery, orthodontics, endodontics, periodontics, prosthodontics, and paediatric dentistry. They all practise from a single location at Level 8, Manchester Unity Building, 220 Collins Street, Melbourne.

The centre runs on a peer review model. For complex cases, that means the relevant specialists sit down together, share diagnostic imaging, and work out a coordinated, sequenced treatment plan before anything begins. Where a patient's treatment involves orthodontics, oral surgery, and prosthodontics, those three clinicians plan as a team rather than each working independently. The outcomes are consistently better for it.

After treatment, your care returns to your local dentist

They're also better placed to recognise and manage complications as they arise, and they have established peer networks for seeking second opinions on particularly challenging cases.

For routine dental needs, your local dentist is the right and most accessible choice. For complex cases — where the margin for error is narrower and the consequences of a suboptimal outcome more significant — a registered specialist is worth seeking out.
