At Collins Street Specialist Centre, we believe that quality dental care is not a matter of chance — it is the result of rigorous training, evidence-based practice, continuous improvement, and a culture of clinical excellence that runs through everything we do.

Specialist Qualifications — The Foundation of Quality

Every specialist at Collins Street Specialist Centre has completed a minimum of three to four additional years of full-time postgraduate university training beyond their dental degree, focused exclusively on their area of expertise. This training is completed at university-affiliated programs in recognised dental specialties, with specialist registration governed by the Dental Board of Australia and involves both advanced clinical practice and research.

What Specialist Training Involves

Specialist training in dentistry is demanding and highly competitive. After completing a Bachelor of Dental Surgery (BDS) or Doctor of Dental Medicine (DMD) — typically a five-year program — dentists who wish to specialise must:

1. ****Gain clinical experience**** — most specialist programs require several years of clinical practice as a general dentist before accepting candidates
2. ****Pass competitive entry**** — specialist training places are limited, and entry is highly competitive across all disciplines
3. ****Complete a postgraduate program**** — a further three to five years of full-time study at a university-accredited program, combining advanced clinical training with academic research
4. ****Pass specialist examinations**** — rigorous assessments that test both theoretical knowledge and clinical competence
5. ****Register as a specialist**** — upon completion, graduates register with AHPRA (the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency) as a specialist in their discipline

This means that by the time a specialist begins practising at CSSC, they have typically completed eight to twelve years of university-level training and supervised clinical practice.

Ongoing Registration and Compliance

All practitioners at CSSC maintain current registration with AHPRA and meet the continuing professional development (CPD) requirements set by the Dental Board of Australia. AHPRA

registration is not a one-time event — it must be renewed annually, and practitioners must demonstrate that they have maintained and developed their skills through ongoing education and training.

Evidence-Based Practice — Grounded in Research

We are committed to evidence-based dentistry, which means that clinical decisions at CSSC are informed by the best available scientific research, combined with clinical expertise and patient preferences.

What This Means in Practice

- **Treatment recommendations based on research** — when we recommend a particular treatment approach, that recommendation is grounded in published scientific evidence about what works, what lasts, and what produces the best outcomes - **Staying current with the literature** — our specialists actively engage with dental research through reading journals, attending conferences, and participating in professional development - **Critical evaluation of new techniques and materials** — we do not adopt new technologies or materials simply because they are new. We evaluate them critically, looking at the evidence for their effectiveness, durability, and safety before incorporating them into our practice - **Transparent communication with patients** — we discuss the evidence base for recommended treatments with patients, including what is well-established and what is less certain

Academic Connections

Several of our specialists hold or have held academic positions at Australian universities, contributing to dental research and the training of future specialists. This connection to the academic world helps ensure that our clinical practice stays aligned with current evidence and best thinking in each specialty.

Peer Review and Multidisciplinary Collaboration

One of the distinctive features of practising in a multi-specialty centre is the opportunity for ongoing peer review and collaboration. At CSSC, specialists regularly discuss cases with colleagues in other disciplines, seek second opinions, and review treatment outcomes together.

How Peer Review Works at CSSC

- **Case discussions** — when a case involves multiple specialties or presents unusual challenges, our specialists can discuss it directly with colleagues, drawing on different perspectives and areas of expertise - **Treatment planning collaboration** — for complex cases, specialists from different disciplines develop a unified treatment plan, ensuring that all aspects of the patient's care are considered and coordinated - **Informal consultation** — the physical proximity of multiple specialists in one building means that quick consultations happen naturally and frequently. A periodontist can step into an endodontist's operatory to discuss a diagnostic question. A prosthodontist can review an orthodontist's progress to confirm the restorative plan is on track - **Outcome review** — by working together over many years, our specialists build a shared understanding of what works well and where improvements can be made

Why This Matters for Patients

In a single-specialty or solo practice, a dentist's clinical decisions are primarily informed by their own experience and judgement. At CSSC, each specialist benefits from the collective experience and perspectives of their colleagues. This does not mean that individual clinical judgement is overridden — rather, it is enriched by access to other viewpoints and areas of expertise.

Technology and Equipment Standards

We invest in modern dental technology where there is clear evidence that it improves diagnosis, treatment outcomes, or patient comfort.

Diagnostic Technology

- **Cone-beam computed tomography (CBCT)** — three-dimensional imaging that provides detailed views of teeth, bone, nerves, and sinuses. Essential for implant planning, complex endodontic cases, and surgical assessment - **Digital radiography** — lower radiation exposure than traditional film X-rays, with immediate image availability and enhanced diagnostic detail - **Intraoral scanning** — digital impressions that are often more comfortable than traditional impression materials and provide highly accurate models for treatment planning and restoration fabrication - **Operating microscopes** — used by our endodontists for high-magnification visualisation during root canal treatment, allowing treatment of fine details that would be impossible to see with the naked eye

Treatment Technology

- **Rotary endodontic systems** — advanced instrumentation for more efficient and predictable root canal treatment - **CAD/CAM technology** — computer-aided design and manufacturing for precise restoration fabrication - **Modern implant systems** — we use implant systems from established manufacturers with long-term research supporting their reliability and performance - **Sedation and monitoring equipment** — comprehensive monitoring during sedation procedures, meeting all relevant safety standards

Our Approach to Technology

We are careful to distinguish between technology that genuinely improves care and technology that is primarily a marketing tool. Every piece of equipment in our centre is there because it serves a clear clinical purpose. We do not invest in gadgets for the sake of appearing "cutting-edge" — we invest in tools that make diagnosis more accurate, treatment more predictable, and the patient experience more comfortable.

Infection Control and Safety

Patient safety is non-negotiable. Our infection control procedures meet or exceed the standards set by the Dental Board of Australia and comply with all relevant Australian and Victorian guidelines.

Our Infection Control Practices Include

- **Instrument sterilisation** — all reusable instruments are cleaned, packaged, and sterilised using validated sterilisation cycles, with routine monitoring to confirm sterilisation effectiveness - **Single-use items** — wherever appropriate, we use single-use disposable items to eliminate any risk of cross-contamination - **Surface disinfection** — treatment areas are thoroughly cleaned and disinfected between patients - **Hand hygiene** — strict hand hygiene protocols in accordance with Australian guidelines - **Personal protective equipment (PPE)** — appropriate PPE is worn by all clinical staff during patient treatment - **Water quality** — dental unit water lines are maintained and monitored to meet applicable water quality standards

Continuing Professional Development

Learning does not stop at specialist registration. Our practitioners are committed to ongoing professional development throughout their careers.

CPD at CSSC

- **Conference attendance** — our specialists regularly attend national and international dental conferences to stay abreast of developments in their fields - **Courses and workshops** — hands-on training in new techniques and technologies, delivered by recognised experts - **Journal clubs and study groups** — regular engagement with current dental literature - **Teaching and mentoring** — several of our specialists teach at postgraduate level, which requires them to stay at the forefront of their disciplines - **Professional society membership** — active membership in relevant specialist societies, such as the Australian Society of Orthodontists, the Australian and New Zealand Academy of Periodontists, the Australian Prosthodontic Society, and others

Meeting Regulatory Requirements

The Dental Board of Australia requires all registered dental practitioners to complete a minimum number of CPD hours in each registration period, covering both scientific and professional development activities. Our practitioners consistently exceed these minimum requirements.

Quality Processes — How We Maintain Standards

Beyond individual qualifications and CPD, we have systems and processes in place to maintain consistently high standards of care across the centre.

Treatment Planning Processes

- **Comprehensive assessment** — new patients receive a thorough examination, including relevant diagnostic imaging and clinical testing, before any treatment is recommended - **Informed consent** — we take the time to explain treatment options, expected outcomes, risks, and alternatives before proceeding. Informed consent is not a form-signing exercise — it is a genuine conversation - **Written treatment plans** — patients receive clear, written treatment plans that outline the recommended care, the sequence of treatment, and associated costs - **Second opinions** — we encourage patients to seek second opinions if they wish, and we are happy to provide second opinions for patients referred from other practices

Patient Communication

- **Clear explanations** — we explain findings and recommendations in plain language, avoiding unnecessary jargon - **Visual aids** — clinical photographs, radiographs, and models are used to help patients understand their condition and treatment options - **Follow-up** — appropriate follow-up appointments are scheduled after treatment, and patients are contacted if any concerns arise - **Feedback** — we welcome patient feedback and use it to improve our services

Several also hold teaching positions at universities.

****What happens if something goes wrong during treatment?**** While complications are uncommon, they can occur with any medical or dental procedure. If a complication arises, we manage it promptly and transparently, drawing on the expertise available within our centre. We discuss potential risks before treatment begins so that you can make informed decisions.

****How do your infection control standards compare to other practices?**** Our infection control procedures meet or exceed the standards set by the Dental Board of Australia and comply with all relevant national and Victorian guidelines. We take infection control seriously and invest in the equipment, training, and processes needed to maintain the highest standards.
