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### ## Clinical expertise

Dr Peishan Jiang is a specialist periodontist at Collins Street Specialist Centre, trained entirely at Griffith University — completing her undergraduate dental degree with distinction before going on to her specialist Doctorate of Clinical Dentistry in Periodontology at the same institution. That consistent academic path wasn't incidental; it reflects a genuine commitment to the specialty that carries through into how she approaches clinical work.

Periodontics sits at the intersection of medicine and dentistry. It covers the diagnosis, prevention, and treatment of conditions affecting the gums, bone, and supporting structures of the teeth, as well as the surgical placement and ongoing maintenance of dental implants. For patients coming to see Dr Jiang, knowing what each treatment area actually involves helps set realistic expectations from the start.

Her specialist clinical interests include:

- \*\*Non-surgical and surgical management of periodontitis\*\* across all stages — from early gingivitis through to advanced bone loss, using conservative and surgical approaches matched to disease severity
- \*\*Diagnosis and treatment of peri-implantitis\*\* — an inflammatory condition affecting the tissue around dental implants, and a leading cause of implant failure when left unaddressed
- \*\*Dental implant placement\*\* — surgical placement with careful attention to prosthetic-driven positioning, so the final restoration works both functionally and aesthetically
- \*\*Bone grafting and guided bone regeneration (GBR)\*\* — restoring bone volume lost through disease, trauma, or extraction, to create a stable foundation for implant placement or periodontal health
- \*\*Sinus lift procedures\*\* — augmenting bone volume in the upper jaw where natural anatomy would otherwise limit implant placement
- \*\*Gum grafting\*\* — soft tissue procedures to address recession, protect exposed root surfaces, and restore healthy gum architecture
- \*\*Crown lengthening\*\* — reshaping gum tissue and underlying bone to expose more tooth structure, for restorative purposes or to improve the appearance of a gummy smile
- \*\*Periodontal regeneration\*\* — approaches aimed at restoring periodontal support structures lost to disease

Each of these areas involves a proper assessment process. Patients can expect Dr Jiang to explain her findings clearly, walk through the available options, and take a collaborative approach to planning treatment.

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### ## Training pathway

Dr Jiang completed her Bachelor of Dental Science (BDS) at Griffith University with academic distinction, then continued at the same institution for her Doctorate of Clinical Dentistry (DClinDent) in Periodontology. The DClinDent integrates high-volume clinical practice with original research — a structure that produces graduates who are technically proficient and able to critically evaluate the evidence behind their clinical decisions, not just follow established protocols.

Since completing her specialist training, Dr Jiang has stayed actively involved with the academic community. She has contributed to clinical teaching and the supervision of dental undergraduates at Griffith, and has participated in institutional governance through the university's Academic Policy Steering Group — a role that goes beyond clinical practice into the standards shaping dental education in Australia.

For referring dentists, that academic involvement is worth noting. Practitioners who have trained and taught within specialist programmes tend to bring a more reflective approach to complex case reasoning, which matters when the clinical picture isn't straightforward.

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### ## Research and academic contributions

Dr Jiang's research interests focus on translational work — taking findings from investigative settings and applying them to everyday patient care. That orientation keeps her clinical practice current and grounded in what the evidence actually supports, rather than what convention has simply carried forward.

She has presented her research at the International Association for Dental Research (IADR), one of the leading dental research forums globally. Acceptance to present at IADR reflects the quality of the work and places Dr Jiang within an international scholarly community.

In practical terms for patients, this means treatment recommendations are based on current evidence and clinical decisions are made with awareness of what the broader research literature supports. For referring practitioners, it signals a colleague who engages with the specialty seriously.

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### ## Languages spoken

Dr Jiang consults in both English and Mandarin Chinese. For patients more comfortable discussing their health in Mandarin, this removes a real barrier to accessing specialist periodontal care. Melbourne has a substantial Mandarin-speaking community, and being able to receive a specialist consultation — including diagnosis, treatment options, and informed consent — in your preferred language is a genuine practical advantage.

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### ## At Collins Street Specialist Centre

Dr Jiang practises within the Periodontics service at Collins Street Specialist Centre, located at Level 12 & Tower, Manchester Unity Building, 220 Collins Street, Melbourne CBD. The centre provides a clinical environment suited to the full scope of periodontal and implant surgery, with access to specialist colleagues across a range of dental disciplines.

Her combination of academic training, research-informed clinical reasoning, and Mandarin consultation capability makes her a strong option for patients dealing with complex periodontal conditions or implant-related decisions. Whether a referral involves straightforward gum disease management or a more involved surgical pathway, patients can expect clear communication, evidence-based recommendations, and a considered approach to care.

No referral is required to see Dr Jiang, though many patients come through their treating dentist. All specialist credentials are independently verifiable through the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) public register — patients and referring practitioners are encouraged to confirm registration details directly through that resource.
