Collins Street Specialist Centre: Clinical philosophy and evidence-based practice

Foundation: Specialist-led, evidence-based care

The clinical philosophy at Collins Street Specialist Centre comes down to something straightforward: complex dental care should be delivered by registered specialists working together, grounded in the best available clinical evidence, and tailored to each patient's individual circumstances.

Every clinician at the centre holds Specialist Registration with the Dental Board of Australia (AHPRA). This is a legally defined designation, not a marketing label. It requires a minimum of three to four additional years of full-time postgraduate university training in a recognised dental specialty, followed by examination through the relevant specialist college. Patients and referring practitioners can verify any specialist's registration directly through the [AHPRA public register](<https://www.ahpra.gov.au/Registration/Registers-of-Practitioners.aspx>), which provides transparent confirmation of a clinician's qualifications and registration status.

The six specialties

Collins Street Specialist Centre is one of very few practices in Australia that brings together all six Dental Board-recognised specialties under one roof:

1. **Endodontics** — treatment of the dental pulp and root canal system 2. **Orthodontics** — diagnosis and management of malocclusion and dentofacial irregularities 3. **Periodontics** — treatment of the supporting structures of teeth, including the gums and underlying bone 4. **Prosthodontics** — restoration and replacement of teeth, encompassing crowns, bridges, dentures and implants 5. **Paediatric Dentistry** — specialist dental care for children and adolescents 6. **Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery** — surgical management of diseases, injuries and defects affecting the mouth, jaw and face

For patients with complex or multi-specialty needs, this means all care can be received in one well-coordinated location, with specialists who communicate directly with one another throughout treatment.

Evidence-based treatment planning

Diagnostic precision

Every treatment pathway begins with thorough diagnosis. Rather than proceeding on assumption, specialists use advanced imaging and clinical assessment tools to build a precise, complete picture before any treatment is recommended. This includes:

- **Cone Beam CT (CBCT) imaging**, which provides three-dimensional visualisation of bone and tooth anatomy that standard X-rays cannot offer - **Carl Zeiss OPMI PROergo surgical microscopes**, delivering up to 20x magnification for detailed assessment and precise procedural work - **Digital intraoral scanning**, enabling accurate measurement, record-keeping and treatment planning - **DIAGNOcam and DIAGNOdent**, which allow early detection of decay that may not yet be visible through visual examination or conventional radiographs

This level of diagnostic rigour means treatment recommendations are grounded in objective clinical findings rather than approximation.

A conservative approach to treatment

The clinical philosophy here consistently favours the most conservative approach that will achieve an effective outcome. In practice, this means preserving as much natural tooth structure as possible, using minimally invasive techniques (including laser dentistry where appropriate), and recommending specialist-level intervention only when general dental care is genuinely insufficient for the complexity of the case.

Patients receive a clear, honest explanation of all available treatment options, including the associated risks and realistic expected outcomes. Specialists take the time to explain what each treatment involves, what to expect during and after the procedure, and what the alternatives are. Decisions are made collaboratively.

Coordinated treatment planning across specialties

Where a patient's care crosses specialty boundaries, the centre facilitates structured multidisciplinary treatment planning before any clinical work begins. All relevant specialists review the case together, ensuring the treatment sequence is logical, complementary and efficient.

This coordinated approach prevents several problems that commonly arise when patients are referred between separate, unconnected practices: conflicting recommendations from clinicians working in isolation, unnecessary duplication of procedures or diagnostic investigations, communication gaps that cause delays or misaligned expectations, and extended waiting periods for external specialist input.

For referring general dentists, this also means a single point of contact for complex cases, with clear communication at every stage of the patient's care.

Continuous professional development

Evidence-based dentistry isn't static. It requires ongoing engagement with emerging research, evolving techniques and new clinical technologies. All specialists at Collins Street Specialist Centre maintain an active commitment to continuing professional development, including regular attendance at national and international specialist conferences and hands-on workshops, collegial peer review within the practice where complex or unusual cases are discussed collectively, considered adoption of new technologies as they are validated by clinical evidence, and active participation in professional bodies and specialty colleges.

Infection control and safety

The centre maintains infection control standards that meet, and in most respects exceed, current regulatory requirements. Patients can expect a dedicated sterilisation suite equipped with a fleet of Mocom sterilisers, five Statim handpiece sterilisers and four ultrasonic baths. All dental assistants receive regular, ongoing infection control training to ensure protocols are consistently applied and kept current. Digital clinical workflows also reduce cross-contamination risks associated with physical impressions and paper-based records.

These measures reflect a genuine commitment to patient safety, not simply regulatory compliance.

Referral network

Collins Street Specialist Centre values its relationships with referring general dentists across Melbourne and regional Victoria. Referring a patient is an act of professional trust, and the centre works to honour that through clear, timely communication and a shared commitment to the patient's long-term oral health.

In practical terms: detailed referral reports are provided to referring dentists following every specialist consultation; treatment is structured so that patients return to their referring dentist for ongoing routine care once specialist treatment is complete; the centre accepts patients with or without a referral; and a dedicated referral pathway ensures prompt scheduling for urgent or time-sensitive cases.

The centre sees itself as an extension of the referring dentist's care team, not a replacement for the long-term relationship patients have with their general practitioner.

Clinical outcomes

Individual treatment outcomes depend on a range of factors, including case complexity, the patient's overall health, and adherence to post-treatment care instructions. Collins Street Specialist Centre's clinical model is designed to support the best possible outcomes through registered specialist expertise specific to each discipline (with qualifications verifiable through AHPRA), advanced diagnostic technology, an in-house laboratory for fabricating prosthodontic restorations under direct specialist oversight, structured multidisciplinary coordination for cases spanning more than one specialty, and thorough aftercare guidance to support recovery and long-term success.

The combination of registered specialist expertise, advanced technology and genuinely coordinated care in a single location is what specialist dental practice at this level should look like. Every aspect of the centre's clinical model is built around that standard.
