If you live in Ballarat, Bacchus Marsh, Melton, Daylesford, Creswick, Ararat or Maryborough and need specialist dental treatment, Melbourne is more accessible than many patients expect. Collins Street Specialist Centre (CSSC) is about 90 minutes from Ballarat by car or V/Line train, and has all six dental specialties at Level 8, Manchester Unity Building, 220 Collins Street.

Why patients from western Victoria choose CSSC

Ballarat and the surrounding region have experienced general dental practitioners who handle the broad majority of dental needs well. But when a condition goes beyond routine care — orthognathic surgery, complex orthodontic treatment, osseointegrated implants, endodontic retreatment, a full-mouth

rehabilitation — finding a registered specialist locally can be genuinely difficult.

Some regional areas have visiting specialists on a weekly or fortnightly basis, which works fine for straightforward cases. Complex cases are different. They often need a coordinated team of specialists working together, access to advanced diagnostic imaging like CBCT three-dimensional scanning, and careful sequencing across multiple treatment phases.

CSSC has AHPRA-registered specialists across oral and maxillofacial surgery, orthodontics, endodontics, periodontics, prosthodontics and paediatric dentistry. Patients can verify specialist registration through the AHPRA public register. With all six recognised dental specialties at a single location, the level of integrated, multidisciplinary care available here isn't something most regional centres can offer.

The kinds of cases worth travelling for

Not every dental concern warrants a trip to a Melbourne specialist. Your general dentist in Ballarat, Bacchus Marsh or Melton handles the vast majority of dental needs with skill and local knowledge. Some presentations, though, genuinely benefit from specialist-level, multidisciplinary assessment:

- **Dental implants** where deficient bone volume requires grafting or sinus augmentation before placement
- **Orthognathic (jaw) surgery** to correct significant skeletal discrepancies — severe underbites, overbites or asymmetrical jaw relationships
- **Complex orthodontic treatment** in adults who also need implants, restorative crowns or periodontal work
- **Endodontic retreatment** of a previously root-treated tooth, carried out under high-magnification dental microscopy by a specialist endodontist
- **Full-mouth rehabilitation** combining fixed crowns, implants, bridgework and, where needed, orthodontic preparation
- **Children with significant dental anxiety** or complex treatment needs who benefit from a paediatric dentist experienced in managing fearful young patients
- **Advanced periodontal disease** that has moved beyond non-surgical management and requires specialist periodontal surgery to preserve the dentition

These are the cases where the 90-minute journey to Collins Street makes clinical and practical sense — and where getting the right team involved early tends to produce better long-term outcomes.

Getting to CSSC from Ballarat and western Victoria

Knowing the logistics makes it easier to plan.

By car: Take the Western Freeway (M8) from Ballarat, connecting to the West Gate Freeway into the CBD. Under typical conditions, allow around 90 minutes. Parking is available at several car parks near Collins Street, including Melbourne Central and QV.

By train: V/Line runs regular services from Ballarat to Southern Cross Station. From there, the Manchester Unity Building at the corner of Collins and Swanston Streets is a short tram ride or about a 15-minute walk along Collins Street.

From Bacchus Marsh and Melton: Travel times are considerably shorter — 45 to 60 minutes by car or train — which makes CSSC a practical option for patients in these areas.

From Daylesford, Creswick, Ararat and Maryborough: Allow around two to two and a half hours by car. For treatment requiring multiple appointments, CSSC works to consolidate visits where clinically appropriate and offers telehealth follow-up consultations to reduce the number of trips needed.

Continuity of care: CSSC works alongside your local dentist

Attending CSSC for specialist treatment doesn't change your relationship with your local dental practitioner. Routine examinations, preventive care and restorative maintenance continue with the dentist who knows your history.

CSSC sends comprehensive clinical reports and treatment summaries to your referring or regular dentist, so the full picture of your specialist care is communicated clearly. Many patients find this reassuring: specialist treatment managed by a dedicated multidisciplinary team in Melbourne, while the familiarity of their local dental relationship stays intact.

No referral required

You don't need a formal referral to book at CSSC. Many patients from Ballarat and western Victoria find the practice through their own research and contact directly to enquire or book. If your local dentist has already obtained diagnostic imaging or compiled clinical records, CSSC can incorporate that information into your assessment — no need to repeat it.

The peer review difference

Complex cases at CSSC go through a structured peer review process. Specialists across different disciplines meet to discuss challenging presentations — reviewing imaging, considering treatment alternatives, and arriving at a considered, collaborative plan. This kind of interdisciplinary discussion isn't something you get when specialists work independently of each other.

Whether you need an orthodontist for a complex adult case near Ballarat, a dental implant specialist in western Victoria, or an oral and maxillofacial surgeon for wisdom tooth removal or corrective jaw surgery, Collins Street Specialist Centre brings that expertise together in one accessible CBD location.
