Box Hill and the surrounding eastern suburbs — Mont Albert, Surrey Hills, Balwyn, Doncaster, Blackburn and Mitcham — make up one of Melbourne's most populous and culturally diverse regions, and demand for specialist dental care reflects that. Collins Street Specialist Centre gives eastern suburbs residents access to over 25 dental specialists across every recognised specialty, all working from a single CBD address.

Getting to CSSC from Box Hill & the Eastern Suburbs

By train Box Hill Station sits on both the Belgrave and Lilydale lines, with direct services to Flinders Street Station:

- **Box Hill Station** to Flinders Street: approximately 25–30 minutes - **Surrey Hills Station** to Flinders Street: approximately 22–25 minutes - **Mont Albert Station** to Flinders Street: approximately 20–25 minutes - **Blackburn Station** to Flinders Street: approximately 30 minutes

From Flinders Street Station, the practice at 220 Collins Street is a five-minute walk. Services run frequently throughout the day, so scheduling around your commitments is straightforward.

Doncaster residents without a direct rail connection can take a bus to Box Hill Station and catch the train from there.

By car Box Hill is roughly 14 km east of the CBD. The drive typically takes 25–40 minutes via the Eastern Freeway, Canterbury Road or Whitehorse Road, depending on traffic. Parking near Collins Street is available at Wilson Parking, 169 Exhibition Street, and the QV car park.

By tram The Route 109 tram runs along Whitehorse Road through Box Hill before continuing directly into the CBD along Collins Street — which makes it one of the more convenient connections to our practice. The trip takes around 40–50 minutes with no transfer required.

Why Eastern Suburbs Residents Choose CSSC

A diverse community with varied clinical needs Box Hill is one of Melbourne's most culturally diverse suburbs, home to well-established Chinese-Australian, Anglo-Australian, Indian, Vietnamese, Korean and other communities. That diversity shapes dental needs in practical ways.

****Overseas dental follow-up:**** Patients who receive dental treatment abroad and return to Melbourne sometimes need follow-up care, management of complications, or completion of partially finished treatment. Our specialists are experienced in assessing and managing these situations.

A referral culture already well established Box Hill Hospital is a major public teaching hospital, and the eastern suburbs support a high concentration of medical and allied health specialists. Residents here — and the practitioners who serve them — already understand the value of specialist-level care.

Common referral pathways to Collins Street Specialist Centre include:

- General dentists referring complex or high-risk cases - Medical practitioners referring patients who need dental assessment before surgery, organ transplantation or chemotherapy - Orthodontists referring to our oral surgeons for combined surgical-orthodontic cases - GPs referring patients with oral lesions, jaw pain or suspected obstructive sleep apnoea

Referring practitioners are welcome to contact us directly before sending a formal referral.

Orthodontic demand across all ages The eastern suburbs have a strong family demographic, and orthodontics is one of the most common reasons families make the trip to Collins Street Specialist Centre.

****Children's orthodontics:**** Early assessment — recommended by age 7 — lets our specialists identify developing concerns with jaw growth, crowding and bite alignment while intervention is still most effective. Phase 1 treatment is recommended where there's a clear clinical case for it, with comprehensive treatment timed to the right developmental stage.

****Teenage orthodontics:**** Comprehensive orthodontic treatment most often happens during adolescence. Our orthodontists offer metal braces, ceramic braces, lingual braces and clear aligner systems, with treatment planning shaped by each patient's clinical picture, growth stage and day-to-day life.

****Adult orthodontics:**** Adults across all demographics are increasingly seeking orthodontic treatment. Clear aligner therapy has made that more accessible — a less visible option for patients who want to address alignment without fixed appliances.

Dental implant services Dental implants are among the most frequently requested treatments from eastern suburbs patients. Several things drive that: an ageing population with tooth loss, a preference for fixed permanent solutions over removable prostheses, greater public awareness of implant options, and a preference for placement by registered specialists.

At Collins Street Specialist Centre, implant treatment follows a structured, team-based process:

1. A ****prosthodontist**** plans the final restoration and determines the ideal implant position to support it
2. An ****oral surgeon or periodontist**** places the implant, frequently using 3D-guided surgical planning
3. The ****prosthodontist**** designs and fits the definitive restoration
4. ****Ongoing maintenance**** monitors the long-term health of the implant and surrounding tissues

This approach means surgical placement, aesthetic outcome and functional longevity are considered together from the start — not addressed separately after the fact.

Full spectrum of specialist services

Collins Street Specialist Centre gives eastern suburbs residents access to every dental specialty at one location:

****Orthodontics**** — Comprehensive care for patients of all ages, from straightforward alignment cases through to complex presentations requiring combined surgical-orthodontic treatment. Options include metal braces, ceramic braces, lingual braces and clear aligners.

****Endodontics**** — Specialist root canal treatment using surgical microscopy. When a tooth's pulp is infected or irreversibly inflamed, precision endodontic therapy offers the best available chance of saving it.

****Periodontics**** — Diagnosis and management of gum disease at every stage, from early gingivitis through to advanced periodontitis with bone loss. Our periodontists also perform bone grafting, soft tissue grafting, regenerative periodontal procedures and dental implant placement.

****Prosthodontics**** — Specialist restoration and replacement of teeth, including crowns, bridges, veneers, complete and partial dentures, implant-supported restorations and complex full mouth rehabilitation.

****Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery**** — Wisdom tooth removal, dental implant placement, bone augmentation, corrective jaw surgery (orthognathic surgery), oral pathology including biopsy and lesion management, facial trauma and temporomandibular joint disorders.

****Paediatric Dentistry**** — Specialist care for infants, children and adolescents, including patients with dental anxiety, special needs, medical complexity and developmental dental conditions.

****General & Cosmetic Dentistry**** — Examinations, restorations, tooth whitening and aesthetic treatments, with direct access to specialist colleagues when the clinical situation calls for it.
