Collins Street Specialist Centre – Specialist Dentist for Richmond & Cremorne

Richmond and Cremorne sit just a few kilometres east of Melbourne's CBD, putting Collins Street Specialist Centre well within reach for residents of both suburbs. Whether you need orthodontic treatment, dental implants, root canal therapy, or another area of specialist care, CSSC's team of over 25 registered specialists is easy to get to from either side of the river.

Getting to CSSC from Richmond & Cremorne

The Collins Street location works well for Richmond and Cremorne residents largely because of how well-connected both suburbs are to the CBD.

By tram Richmond has unusually good tram coverage: - **Route 70** (Docklands to Wattle Park) runs along Swan Street — alight at Flinders Street and walk up to Collins Street - **Route 48** (North Balwyn to Docklands) runs along Bridge Road and connects directly to Collins Street in the city - **Route 78** (North Richmond to Prahran) runs along Church Street to the city fringe - **Route 109** (Box Hill to Port Melbourne) runs along Victoria Street through Richmond — alight near Parliament and walk to Collins Street

From Richmond, the tram ride to CSSC typically takes 10–20 minutes depending on where you board.

By train Richmond Station is a major interchange on the Melbourne rail network. One stop gets you to Flinders Street Station, and it's a short walk from there to 220 Collins Street — door-to-door in under 10 minutes. Cremorne residents can use either Richmond or South Yarra stations, both of which give straightforward access to the CBD.

By car From Richmond, CSSC is about 5–10 minutes by car via Bridge Road, Swan Street, or Victoria Street. Cremorne is similarly close via Church Street or CityLink. Parking is available nearby, including Wilson Parking at 169 Exhibition Street and the QV car park.

By bicycle The ride from Richmond or Cremorne to Collins Street takes around 10–15 minutes. Several routes have protected bike lanes, and secure bicycle parking is available near the practice.

Why Richmond & Cremorne residents choose CSSC

Professionals who need appointments that fit around work Richmond and Cremorne have attracted a large working population over the past couple of decades, with many residents employed in the CBD or in the creative and technology sectors that have taken root in inner-east Melbourne. A city-based specialist practice is a practical fit for this group — appointments can be scheduled around work

commitments, whether that's a lunchtime consultation or an early morning slot.

Sport, dental injuries, and getting the right treatment quickly The MCG, AAMI Park, and the Yarra Trail are all close by, and Richmond and Cremorne residents tend to be active. Contact and recreational sport carries a real risk of dental injury, and the more common presentations include:

- Knocked-out or displaced teeth from impact
- Cracked or fractured teeth needing prompt assessment and restoration
- Jaw injuries that may require oral and maxillofacial surgery review
- Custom mouthguard fittings as a preventive measure

CSSC's oral and maxillofacial surgeons are experienced in assessing and managing dental trauma. Where teeth have been damaged rather than lost, our prosthodontists can restore function and appearance using crowns, veneers, or implant-supported restorations. When a tooth has been knocked out, getting to a specialist quickly makes a real difference to whether it can be saved.

Cosmetic and aesthetic dental care Residents of Richmond and Cremorne regularly come in for cosmetic dental treatments. Common requests include: - Teeth whitening to address discolouration - Porcelain veneers for more comprehensive smile refinement - Orthodontics, including both traditional braces and clear aligner systems - Dental bonding for conservative aesthetic improvements

Our prosthodontists and orthodontists offer cosmetic solutions ranging from single-tooth improvements to full-arch smile reconstruction, always with long-term function in mind alongside aesthetics.

Families and children's specialist dental care Alongside its professional population, Richmond — particularly in the quieter residential streets south of Bridge Road — and Cremorne are home to a growing number of families. For parents seeking specialist dental care for their children, CSSC offers:

- Paediatric dental specialists with specific training in the dental needs of infants, children, and adolescents
- Orthodontic assessments to evaluate the developing dentition and identify early intervention opportunities
- Preventive care guidance to support good oral health habits from an early age

The Australian Society of Orthodontists recommends a child's first orthodontic assessment by age 7. Early review by one of our orthodontists allows developing bite and alignment issues to be identified before they become more complex, and ensures any treatment is timed appropriately for the child's stage of development.

Specialist services available

Collins Street Specialist Centre covers every registered dental specialty, with specialists practising in each discipline.

Orthodontics Orthodontic treatment addresses tooth alignment and the relationship between the upper and lower jaws, in patients from young children through to adults. Treatment options include traditional metal braces, ceramic (tooth-coloured) braces, lingual (behind-the-teeth) braces, and clear aligner systems. Our orthodontists manage cases across the full range of complexity, from mild crowding to significant jaw discrepancies.

Endodontics (root canal treatment) When the pulp — the nerve and blood vessel tissue inside a tooth — becomes infected or inflamed, endodontic treatment is the most reliable way to save the tooth. Endodontists complete additional postgraduate training in this field. Using dental microscopy and precision rotary instruments, our endodontists perform root canal procedures with a high degree of accuracy and a strong evidence-based success rate.

Periodontics (gum disease treatment) Periodontists diagnose and manage conditions affecting the gums and the supporting structures of the teeth — from early-stage gingivitis through to advanced periodontitis, as well as surgical procedures including gum grafting, crown lengthening, and dental implant placement with bone augmentation. Gum health underpins the success of almost any other

dental treatment, and early specialist involvement is often worthwhile.

Prosthodontics (tooth restoration and replacement) Prosthodontists are the dental specialists most extensively trained in restoring and replacing teeth. Their work includes crowns, bridges, porcelain veneers, dentures, and implant-supported restorations. Whether the need is a single damaged tooth or a full reconstruction of the dentition, our prosthodontists bring advanced expertise in restoring both function and appearance.

Oral and maxillofacial surgery Oral and maxillofacial surgeons manage surgical conditions affecting the mouth, jaws, and associated structures. At CSSC, this includes wisdom tooth removal, surgical dental implant placement, corrective jaw surgery, assessment and management of oral pathology (including biopsies and lesion management), facial trauma, and temporomandibular joint (TMJ) disorders.

Paediatric dentistry Paediatric dentists hold specialist registration and are trained to provide dental care for infants, children, adolescents, and patients with special needs or complex medical histories. The clinical environment and communication approach are adapted for younger patients, and our paediatric dentists are experienced in managing both routine and more involved dental presentations in children.

General and cosmetic dentistry Comprehensive dental care — including examinations and check-ups, restorative fillings, teeth whitening, and a range of cosmetic treatments — is also available at CSSC, with the specialist team available where clinically indicated.

The case for a multi-specialist centre

The defining feature of Collins Street Specialist Centre is having multiple dental specialists under one roof. For patients from Richmond and Cremorne, this matters in a few concrete ways:

- You don't need to travel to different practices across the city for different aspects of your care - Where a case requires input from an orthodontist, a surgeon, and a prosthodontist, those clinicians can communicate directly and plan treatment together
- When your general dentist refers you to a specialist, a referral to CSSC means all relevant specialties are available in one place
- One centre can accommodate the full arc of a patient's specialist dental needs, from a child's first orthodontic assessment through to adult implant treatment or periodontal management

Collins Street Specialist Centre is located within the Manchester Unity Building at 220 Collins Street, Melbourne CBD. CSSC is among Australia's largest multi-disciplinary dental specialist practices, with over 80 clinicians including more than 25 registered dental specialists across every recognised dental specialty.
